History of the Estate

The Château is a very pretty Girondine Charterhouse, typical of the region, built entirely in Saint-Émilion stone, and dating from the end of the 18th century. Divided into 5 plots, the vineyards are all located on sandy-gravel soils at the foot of the village of Saint-Emilion. The sandy-gravelly soil makes it possible to obtain fine wines, as well as achieve great ripening.

Winemaking and Vinification

12.50 hectares of vines and an average yield per hectare of 55 hl-hectare. The average age of the plants is 50 years old. Harvest by machine to achieve maximum maturity. Fermentation in low-capacity concrete vats to separate each plot of the property before aging for 12 months in French oak barrels made by coopers Darnajou and Sylvain (20% new barrels and 80% barrels with 1 to 2 years of use).
